The Ministry of Forests has a mandate to manage specified Crown land and resources in a manner that embraces the economic, environmental and social goals of government. These results are all essential to improving the global competitiveness of BC industry and our ability to attract private investment and to stimulate economic growth and job creation across the province.

As the Resource Manager, you will be a key member of the Peace Natural Resource District management team responsible for overseeing several programs, including forest and range stewardship, authorizations, forest revenue, office administration and management of the Districts network of Forest Service Roads. You will also take an active role in supporting the planning and management of other crown resources such as lands, water, fish, wildlife and ecosystems. You will be accountable for managing the delivery of district-wide operations consistent with Ministry priorities, objectives, and legislative requirements. You will have considerable independence and autonomy within a collaborative environment, leading a diverse, high performing team comprised of technical, administrative and professional staff.

Qualifications for this role include:

- University degree or diploma in a field related to natural resource management and 5 years of directly related experience; an equivalent combination of related education and a minimum 7 years' directly related experience may also be considered.
- Directly related experience is defined as experience in one or more of the following example disciplines: forest tenures or stewardship, range, engineering, First Nations, other relevant natural resource discipline.
- Minimum 1 year of experience in operational management of natural resource management, such as tenures, stewardship, range, engineering, First Nations, or other relevant natural resource discipline.
- Minimum 1 year program management experience which may include allocating resources, budget management and/or business planning.
- Minimum 1 year experience developing and maintaining working relationships and resolving complex multi-stakeholder issues with First Nations, stakeholders, clients and/or partners in natural resource management.
- Recent experience (in the last 5 years) in human resource management direct supervision, and in leading and coaching diverse teams.
- Financial management experience including expense authority, budgets, forecasts, etc.
- Preference may be given to candidates who are currently a Registered Professional Forester, Registered Forest Technologist, Professional Agrologist or Registered Professional Biologist.
